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# Dear Friend,

This spring, Feeding America, the national network of Food Banks, released its annual Map the Meal Gap Report, showing that the amount of money neighbors need to be food secure reached its highest level in 20 years.

Rising prices, especially food prices, contributed in part to the increase. Map the Meal Gap builds upon the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) latest report, which showed a sharp increase in food insecurity amid historically high food prices and the expiration of pandemic-era programs.

In summary, pandemic assistance ended right as inflation skyrocketed. Things are tough out there right now and have been for some time now. For some of us, this is an inconvenience. For many, it is more dire.

For single parent Michael of Navasota (page 4), who has two daughters at home who depend on him, the Grimes County Mobile Pantry, a program of the Brazos Valley Food Bank (BVFB) provides stability in this time of great uncertainty. For Angel and her family, the Fresh Produce Drop conducted by BVFB at the local Woman, Infant and Children Program (WIC), as well as visits to nearby food pantries, "takes so much stress off" because the family's one income is no longer enough.

Many more families like Michael and Angel live right here in the Brazos Valley and are our neighbors. Thousands of Brazos Valley families facing hunger can only thrive when basic needs – like food – are met. Imagine telling your child there is nothing to eat.

I hope that these local stories of unprecedented need inspire you to continue to give. We need you.

"We have been in several instances where we didn't have food in the house," Angel says. "I don't

The family applied for SNAP benefits, and Angel and her husband are working hard to find a way to pay bills and put healthy food on the table for the children in the meantime.

"It's constant juggling and stretching resources," Angel says. "It's shocking how fast everything adds up."
